Pleasanton, Calif. – Alameda County Fair hosts three popular commercial wine competitions, as well as an amateur division, each year prior to Fair season. From the hundreds of entries received, the following are the top medal winners for each of this year's competitions:

2016 Alameda County Wine Competition

This competition is open exclusively to commercially bonded wineries located within Alameda County. A total of 170 medals were awarded from 228 entries, 25 of them Gold. Top honors were given to the following wines:
