Alameda County Fairgrounds Invited To Meta Small Business Summit

COO Angel Moore Attends and Learns the Power of Small Business

Pleasanton, Calif. – The Alameda County Agricultural Fair Association was represented for the fourth year by Angel Moore (Chief Operating Officer) amongst 200 small-medium-sized businesses from across the nation at the Meta Boost Business Leaders Network Summit last week in Washington, D.C. The Summit came at a fitting time as April 28-May 4, 2024 marked National Small Business Week.

Attendees received training on measuring social media reach, online privacy integrity, and powering small businesses with AI. The Summit also provided networking opportunities with other small businesses across the nation to collaborate and exchange ideas.

The Alameda County Agricultural Fair Association will continue to attend the Meta Boost Business Leaders Network Summit to stay up to date in an ever-changing, social media-powered world.
